



## **CITY OF BLAIR LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR "DANGEROUS DOGS" OR "POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS"**

The City of Blair Municipal Code requires additional licensing requirements for dogs which have been designated by the Courts as a "dangerous dog" or by the City as a "potentially dangerous dog". If your dog is deemed as such, you must also comply with the following requirements to complete licensing:

- **Sec. 6-129:** Provide proof that such dog has been spayed or neutered and implanted with a microchip identification by a licensed veterinarian. Renewal licenses will not require additional proof.
- **Sec. 6-134:** Provide proof of current personal liability insurance in the amount of \$100,000 or greater to the City. Such insurance shall be maintained in effect for the period such dangerous or potentially dangerous dog is so designated

According to **Sec. 6-131** of the Blair Municipal Code, it shall be unlawful for any person owning, harboring, or having the care of a dangerous or potentially dangerous dog to permit such dog to go beyond the property of such person unless the dog is under the control of a person 19 years of age or older and restrained securely by a harness and leash no longer than 6 feet and properly muzzled as to reasonably prevent the dog from biting.

## **CITY OF BLAIR HANDLING REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIED DOG BREEDS**

According to **Sec. 6-132** of the Blair Municipal Code, it shall be unlawful for any persons owning, harboring or having the care of a pit bull to permit such dog to be outdoors unless confined in a securely fenced yard or unless the dog is under the control of a person 19 years of age or older, restrained securely by a harness and leash no longer than six feet and properly muzzled to reasonably prevent the dog from biting. "Pit bull" shall be defined as any dog that is an:

- American Bulldog
- American Pit Bull Terrier
- American Staffordshire Terrier
- Cane Corso
- Dogo Argentina
- Presa Canario
- Staffordshire Bull Terrier
- or any dog displaying the majority of such physical traits of any one or more of the above breeds (more so than any other breed), or any dog exhibiting those distinguishing characteristics which substantially conform to the standards established by the American Kennel Club or United Kennel Club for any of the above breeds.
